Starting a Project, Saturday 18th June 2005

The second workshop was held at the Archaeological Resource Centre in York on a hot summer afternoon. It focussed on how to go about starting an archaeology project and how to get funding. Two talks were given. The first, by Eliza Gore, Community Archaeologist for Greater York, looked at sources of information for new groups and provided pointers on how to access archaeological data and where to get hold of relevant maps, documentary sources, and artefacts from previous fieldwork.
